RIO GRANDE VALLEY QUILT GUILD GENERAL MEETING – JANUARY 13, 2018

The meeting was called to order by Carla Mewhinney, Outgoing President, at 9:00 am at the Alamo Rec-Veh Park in Alamo.

Carla Mewhinney brought the Standing Committee Chairpersons to the front to thank them for the work they are doing for the guild and to also pledge to support the guild this coming year of 2018. Those in attendance were: Vicki Guerra, Subee Redd, Evelyn Fincher, Renee Darkis, Karen Dill, Terry Davis, Bonnie Cassidy, Bonnie Hall, Maggie Putney, and Diane Wolfe, Bonnie Hall. Not in attendance: Lora Nunn, Elaine Muzichuk and Karyn Heaney.

Carla introduced and asked each new officer to pledge to serve the RGVQG this next year in their respective roles. Kathe LeTulle, President; Joy Paugh, Secretary; Karon Jacobson, Treasurer; Bonnie Hall, Membership 1st VP; Rick Redd, Community Service-2nd VP; Judy Brown, Programs-3rd VP; Deb Warner, 2019 Quilt Show Chair.

Kathe LeTulle recognized Carla Mewhinney for her outstanding years of service to the guild. Carla was presented with a certificate to attend the guild classes.

SECRETARY REPORT: Joy Paugh asked if there were any questions, changes or corrections to be made to the December 9, 2017 minutes from the general meeting. There were no corrections. The minutes were then accepted as printed in the December newsletter.

MEMBERSHIP: Bonnie Hall stated that the guild now has 358 members. For those past members that have not renewed their membership, they have until break time of the February 10, general meeting to renew their membership in order to be eligible for the scholarship drawing. Three scholarships are awarded every February to 3 guild members. These scholarships are \$600.00 for use with a international/national recognized shows or classes. Three alternates will also be drawn in the event the 3 winners cannot use the certificates. Registration for membership can be done on-line or at the monthly meetings. Today's new members were asked to stand.

NEWSLETTER: Diana Wolfe said that Laurel Powell won the contest of renaming the RGVQG Newsletter. The new name is LIFE IN STITCHES.

PROGRAMS: Judy Brown encouraged those in attendance to pick up their Ricky Tims class tickets. Judy also reviewed the upcoming speakers. Victoria Findlay Wolfe's class, Wedding Ring, has openings. February, Barn Quilts by Suzi Parron has openings. March, Marci Baker also has openings left in her classes. If you have suggestions of speakers for future programs, please let Judy know. Registration for the 2018-2019 class schedule will be available on-line in May.

QUILT SHOW VOLUNTEERS: Renee Darkis encouraged members to sign up to volunteer to work at the quilt show, January 25 and 26, at Padre Island Convention Center. Volunteers that work the show are given free entry for the day that they work. E-mails will be sent to each volunteer reminding them of their work schedule.

Kathe LeTulle said that there were 168 in attendance today with 13 guests.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: Rick Redd read the December Community Service numbers: Total items-1269, Total hours-6172, Total value-\$44,747.00. In February Rick will present the 2017 calendar year report. 2017 value is close to \$200,000.00. He thanked the guild for their work and asked them to keep up the good work.

Community Service will share a room at the quilt show with the Military Quilts and also the youth program. Sewing machines will be set up. Kits will be ready for visitors to sit and sew a block. The blocks will then be sewn into a quilt by Subie Redd and other members.

CHALLENGE and MINIATURE QUILTS: Paula McCutcheon announced that the voting on the Challenge quilts and the miniature quilts would be held in one of the side rooms, today, during break.

OPPORTUNITY QUILT TICKETS – can be picked up and paid for today. (Jan Baetke and Diane Towell)

MILITARY SERVICE QUILTS: Carla Mewhinney and Renee Darkis are overseeing the Military Service Quilts. Deb Blackburn stepped down due to health reasons. Last week a military sew day was held at Green Gate and 55 ladies were in attendance. 19 tops were completed. Wednesday, January 17, another sew day will be held at Tropic Gardens in Alamo. They will be

making kits for members to take and sew. The board approved funds for an Accu-Cutter to be purchased. This machine will help in cutting of squares and strips for the military service quilts. The group needs help to get the quilts quilted. The quilts can be quilted on a domestic as well as longarm machine. Quilts may be turned in at the monthly meetings. See Carla or Renee if you would like to quilt one of the quilts.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH: Bonnie Cassidy awarded a \$25.00 certificate to Kathe LeTulle for her completing a project with the December blocks. Kathe is giving her quilt to a young man in Llano Grande Lake Park. Karen Knowlton was the winner of the January blocks. The February block is February 19, Mosaic Variation. It will be done in brown and pink. Community Service would be willing to accept any of these complete quilts for distribution.

Monica Myers described a method to insure your machine is doing a true quarter inch seam. Stitch together 4 strips of fabric each 1.5 inch by 6 inch in length with a quarter inch seam. The final width measurement should be 4.5 inches.

A 30-minute break was provided. Voting for the challenge and miniature quilts were performed over break.

Karon Jacobson announced that she would not be in attendance at the February 10 meeting. She asked for a volunteer to take pictures for the meeting. Ellie Gardhouse accepted the task.

SUNSHINE and SHADOWS: Maggie Putney sent a card to Jeanne Huff. Please let Maggie know if a member is in need of a card.

RETREATS: Jeanne Peterson has five people from the Friendship Star Retreat that have not made their final payment. Please see Jeanne today, as there are 5 people on the waiting list.

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Kathe LeTulle is looking for a person to volunteer to be at the Hospitality table. They would greet and sign in members each month.

The guild is also looking for an individual to be the 2020 Quilt Show Chairman. This person would be able to shadow Deb Warner as she is the 2019 Quilt Show Chairman.

Lila Helms and Judy Brown asked for a show of hands of those interested in a digital embroidery group. There were a number of interested members.

FAT QUARTER DRAW: Drawing was held.

QUILT SHOW 2018: Alice Gibson gave a run down of the 2018 quilt show. Alice thanked all the Chair people and their committees. This year there was one less quilt than last year. This year there will be the same number of vendors but a few are new to the show. There will be separate entrances for pre-paid attendees and volunteers. Church of Christ, 1220 S. Bridge in Weslaco is the drop off and pick up point for the quilts (entry items). The appraiser has a full schedule for appraising quilts. The Style Show is for wearables, quilted and non-quilted. Opportunity ticket goal is \$10,000.00. At this time we have about half of the amount sold. Channel 5 will be covering the quilt show. The show will be featured on *INSIDE THE VALLEY* on January 21st. Facebook, PSA announcements, and Coastal Current are some of the promotional outlets. The show doors open at 8:30 for volunteers and for those bringing sewing machines in for classes. The rooms are locked when not in use so your machine is secure. Programs and ballots are ready for those attending the quilt show. Times are 9am to 5pm Friday and 9am to 4pm on Saturday. Ricky Tims concert is 7pm on Friday evening.

Quilt Show Report December 2017

The Boutique is looking for new sale items this year. This will give the Bees an opportunity to have at least one creative sew day to make smaller, interesting, salable items for the Boutique.

Challenge quilts; hopefully you are all working on your challenge, remember they must be brought to the January meeting for judging by your peers the winners will receive ribbons that day. Please keep these ribbons at home when you bring them for Receiving to go to SPI. Your quilts will be hung for voting as per other categories.

Community Service/Military Service/Youth sewing room has been set up for the use of those attending the show having an opportunity to sew and learn from the instructors in the room. This is intended to end up at the end of the show to have completed quilt tops for donation once they are quilted.

Fashion Show is a hot item on the program again this year. The registration is on the website. Please complete the form with as much information as possible about your garment for the commentary. We are hoping for group projects as well as individual items to demonstrate our very skilled designers of wearable arts.

Small quilts, at the meeting Saturday, we had only 22 quilts in the Yellow Bag. This group is part of our fund-raising for the guild. These quilts are to be no more than 36 x 36". They will be voted on at the January meeting, the prize-winning quilts are will be sold with a ribbon so the purchaser will know the value of what they are purchasing. The makers of the prize-winning quilts will receive a cash reward; First \$100.00, Second \$50.00, Third \$25.00. The minimum bid on all quilts will be \$20.00.

Registering of quilts for the show is going at about the same rate as last year, 58 quilts. We need a lot more to have a good selection for those at the show to see and get inspired by. PLEASE FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS FOR FOLDING AND BAGGING TO MAKE THE RECEIVING OF THE QUILTSTO GO SMOOTHLY. The last on-site registration day will be at Grace Episcopal Church 701 S. Missouri St. Weslaco TX. 10 am – 12 noon.

Receiving and Distribution of quilts will be at Church of Christ 1050 S. Bridge St. Weslaco TX. Both times are from 10 am to 12 noon. For those who are attending the Luminarium don't forget to leave the name of the person picking up your quilts on the form you will leave at that time. This is important because we must retain continuity of the quilts for insurance purposes. This will make it a smoother process for all involved and shorten waiting time on your behalf.

Programs there are still openings in all classes, lectures, evening performance, and Luminarium. Please feel free to go on line and feel that you will be able to learn from the best.

Vendors we have 29 confirmed vendors and at least one very interested. There will be lots of opportunity to meet your shopping needs. Ricky Tims will have his store open during the show for the benefit of all our attendees at the show.

Opportunity Quilt we are in great need of members taking the quilt to your parks to sell tickets, our goal is to raise \$10,000.00 for the guild to run the operations of the organization.

Irish Traveler Mystery Quilt, Month 4

This is a mystery that will take you on a trip through the Irish countryside. The winding pattern is a great way to begin your travels into quilting, while still entertaining for more experienced quilters.

Irish Traveler Mystery Quilt – Month #4

- 1) Gather 16 Roads & Hedges, 16 left Lamb Legs, and 16 right Lamb Legs. Sew the Lamb Legs onto each end of the Roads & Hedges, then press away from the Roads & Hedges.



- 2) Sew this section on the top of each of the center sections, and press.
- 3) Gather 16 Cliffs of Moher, 16 Irish Crosses, and 16 left Lamb Legs. Sew the Strata side of A Irish Cross piece to the Dk. Background side of the Cliffs of Moher, press toward the Irish Cross. Sew the left Lambs Leg on to the left side of each of the Cliff of Moher, press toward the Lambs Leg.
- 4) Sew this section to the bottom of each of the Center Sections, and press.
- 5) When finished you should have 16 blocks.

Victoria Findlay Wolfe class on Friday from 1:00 - 5:00 still has openings for the Double Wedding Ring pillow. (Details are on our web page.)

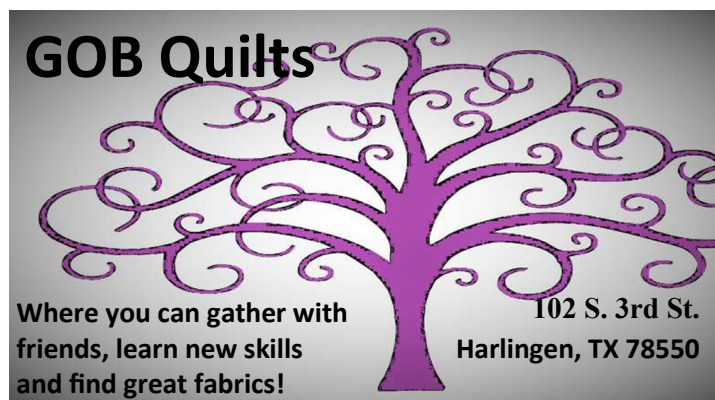
