RGVQG General Meeting Minutes, August 11, 2018

Kathe LeTulle, President, opened the meeting at 9:00 A.M.

Lila Helm presented a talk on "Machine Embroidery Basics".

Secretary – Joy Paugh: The July Minutes were printed in the July newsletter. There was one correction. Instead of a "Next month, a .50 cent charge will be requested from those that come without their name tags", the

correction is: A .50 cent charge will be requested from those members attending the general meeting without their name tag beginning in November 2018.

Treasurer – Karon Jacobson: The current bank balance is \$584.84.

Kathe LeTulle – Today we had 50 members and 3 guests in attendance. RGVQG brochure is available today at pick up. The guild will be looking for a new librarian. Perspective librarian needs 10 feet of wall space and preferably be a year-round resident. Committee people, please provide Karon Jacobson with 2 budgets. One for October, November, December of 2018, and the other one for January through December of 2019. Any members with guild inventory in their homes, please make a list and provide it to Karon Jacobson.

Membership – Mike Hall for Bonnie Hall: Membership numbers have not changed since July. Those planning on becoming a member in 2019 may pay in October 2018 and receive 3 months free. Membership cards will be provided at the November meeting.

Military Service Quilts: Carla Mewhinney: 95 quilts were presented to the VA Center in McAllen. An article was printed in The Monitor. Sew day planned for November 30, at Winter Ranch, Tower and 495. MSQ has quilts ready to be quilted. Harlingen VA Hospital will be the next VA to receive quilts. It was noted that the Harlingen VA Hospital will gladly receive regular pillowcases, (non-quilted).

Programs – Lila Helms for Judy Brown: February Quilt Show classes with Cathie Geier are now on line. Watch the newsletter for more program information.

Sunshine and Shadows – Maggie Putney: Cards were sent to Judy Brown and her husband. It was noted that Sandy Siehr passed away. Sandy was in charge of the fat quarter draw for many years.

Friendship Day – Maggie Putney: The Friendship Day will be at Alamo Rec-Veh on September 8. Beachy theme. Sign up to bring a salad or dessert. Please bring friends.

Newsletter – Diana Wolf: Deadline for August newsletter articles are August 15.

Community Service – Rick Redd: July Numbers: Total Items – 144, Total Hours – 3304, Total Value \$23,954.00. Year to Date Value: \$175,000.

Youth Sewing Classes – Subie Redd: Members that would like to contribute 60" tape measures, please bring them to the September meeting. At this time, sewing classes are set for once a month with 10 per class.

School House Classes – Sandy Gurney for Karen Dill: All the School House Classes for 2018 – 2019 are on-line. There are a few openings in each class.

Retreat – Bev Kramer for Karyn Heaney: This year will mark our 20th year of retreats. Emerald represents 20 years. Green shirts are being sold for \$15.00, for those attending the retreats.

Quilt Walk – 2019 Quilt Show – Linda Haderer: Linda shared bags donated to the Quilt Walk. A South of the Border, Texas Bag, and a child's bag were donated. The Quilt Walk Committee wants bags/totes for the raffle at the quilt show in February. The committee is also asking for items to place in the bags.

Scholarships – Evelyn Fincher: Rosario and Eric, the 2 scholarship winners, have registered at their respective schools.

Garage Sale – Evelyn Fincher: October 8 is the final day to request a table for the October 13 meeting/ Garage Sale. Doors will be open at 7:30 A.M.

Other Business:

The guild's annual elections are held at the November meeting. Kathe LeTulle, Joy Paugh, Karyn Heaney,

Maggie Putney and Jan Baethke are on the election committee. Positions open: Community Service,

Membership-1st Vice President, and Treasurer.

There will not be any Show and Tell at the September and October meeting.

Fabric Draw – Rick and Subie Redd: Today was their last day to oversee the fabric draw. They have enjoyed 2.5 years of providing fabric for the draw. Sandy Gurney and Esther Schmidt will begin the draw responsibilities in November.

February is on so exciting with our program speaker, **Weeks Ringle** and our **Quilt Show** teacher **Cathy Geier**. Week's Thursday and Friday classes are filling as are Cathy's Friday and Saturday classes at the Quilt Show. We expect all these classes to fill, so sign up early to guarantee yourself a spot.



Bee News








