Rosario Garcia guided attendees along the quilt history timeline. As we strolled along the timeline, not falling asleep, aptly watching the slide show which showed the evolution from geometric stitching to embroidery to modern day piecing. Thanks to Rosario for her extensive research for a very interesting lecture.

Upcoming events will be September - Friendship day and October – Rummage Sale. Keep these activities in mind and begin gathering a recipe for September and items to sell for October.

A FRIENDLY REMINDER: At the 2020 Quilt Show, an appraiser will be on hand. Her appraisal fee per quilt will be \$50.00 – either entered in the show or requested independently. Remember for Insurance Purposes, if your quilt is not appraised and there is a disaster (fire, flood, etc.) your insurance will only allow WalMart Blanket pricing. You be the judge.

The appraiser will also do privately and pro-actively what is called "judged" or a professional critique of the quilt. If you have an interest into entering into a JUDGED QUILT SHOW, the private information will be an asset. She will define in writing positives and negatives to assist in helping you overcome negative barriers and become uplifted by the things you do positively. The fee is only \$5.00 with a limit of 50. Take advantage if you can.

Do not forget the **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**. Make a block and join in the fun of it all. Remember to return the guild **LIBRARY BOOKS**. Other members may wish to check the books out.

Maybe I am requesting early – but please begin thinking toward the 2023 Quilt Show as position of QUILT SHOW CHAIRPERSON. That gives one plenty of time to complete tasks – as theme, design show pin, opportunity quilt committee, shadow current quilt show chairpersons, and show committee chairs. It is never too early!

A few more are leaving the valley heading north or parts unknown - Safe Travels.

Reminiscing about the Guild

There were about 400 members when the Guild was created as a nonprofit organization on November 30, 1999.

In 2005, Schoolhouse classes were \$10.00, held in a free location. Generally, the teachers were not paid, and sometimes not reimbursed for their cost of class materials. We still charge \$10.00, we pay the Guild member schoolhouse teachers \$150.00, and we rent space for the classes.

In 2006, a 25th Anniversary luncheon was held, which makes the beginning of the group about 1981. Special quilting rulers were given to luncheon attendees, and some present members still have them.

Also, in December 2006, the total Guild assets were reported to be \$50,498.01.

In February 2009, the Board transferred to \$15,000 to savings with the intend to purchase a certificate of deposit was purchased to add to two other CDs of \$7,274.59 and \$7,016.19.

The Quilt Show in 2009 was quite successful, and the Guild was given \$15,000 from Show profits. There was also money left in the Show Board budget for the following year. We also presented two scholarships of \$2000 to two high school students who were going to college. Scholarships were given for several years prior, and continue to be given.

In 2013, the Quilt Show was very successful and \$20,000 was given to the Guild from show profits.

But, in 2014, the Quilt Show proceeds were spectacular, and partly due to a contract broken by the event center, the Guild received \$25,000 in profits, still leaving money for the Show board to start efforts for the next year.

These are incomplete numbers and do not report Guild expenditures through the years.

It does show simply amazing results by Guild members who give of their time and energy to our organization.

Secretary

Rio Grande Valley Quilt Guild Minutes – General Meeting July 13th, 2019.

The meeting was called to order by President, Kathe Letulle at 9:09 am. She requested a prayer be said for all those hurt in the recent flooding in the Valley.

Secretary: Judi Swanda, in for Joy Paugh asked if there were any changes/corrections to the minutes from the last meeting. There being none, minutes were accepted as posted.

Treasurer: Diane Tewel reports that as of June 1st there was a beginning balance of \$14,934.99 in the checking account and after expenditures of \$4,887.05 and income of \$368.40 the balance as of June 30th was \$10,390.76. Savings Balance is \$33,137.83. This will be filed for audit.

President, Kathe Letulle then introduced our Guest Speaker, Rosario Garcia who spoke on "Quilting a Century Long Passion". After her presentation Rosario described a project that she and her brothers are doing making Bookmarks out of fabric to raise money to assist students with costs of tuition and books. Several members donated to this cause.

Kathe thanked Rosario for her presentation and a break was taken.

Meeting re-convened at 10:30 am.

Membership reported that we had one guest today with 45 members present. We now have 321 members.

Webmaster: Bonnie Hall reminded everyone that on the bottom of the web page there was sites leading to Facebook, Crafty/now Blueprint and the Quilting Hub. If you wish to purchase from Crafty please go there from this site as we get a percentage of the amt. bought.

Newsletter: News due on the 15th. Diana would like some more articles for the newsletter.

Retreat: There is one opening for the Friendship Retreat and 14 waiting on the Bluebonnet Retreat.

Sunshine & Shadows: We ask for prayers for all of the following who are encountering medical issues: Rick Redd, Judi Swanda, Susan Coleman Kathy Weber and Lucy Klass.

Community Service: During June there was a total of 203 items, for 1340 hours and a total value of \$9,715.00. Value for 1st Quarter was \$66,663.75; 2nd quarter \$70,999.25 for a YTD of \$137.663.00

Military Service: A letter was read from a recipient's family thanking the guild for the quilt. Unfortunately, the gentleman passed before it could be presented, and the quilt was given posthumously.

Library: Please return outstanding books.

Nominating Committee: Looking for members to run fir President, Secretary and Programs.

BOM: Next month will be July 31st in the calendar. "Townhouse" finishes at 8".

This will be posted in newsletter and on web.

Quilt Show: Sarah would like members to pick up and sell, sell, sell tickets for the Opportunity Quilt. Karen Hunger advised that she is working on a way to sign up for volunteering on the web.

By-Laws: The committee continues to work on changes to the by-laws.

Military Service Quilts - Pam Manley and Lucy Klass


At the August general meeting, Elaine Hall is graciously helping us and will have kits and binding, should you decide to piece or bind some quilts for our veterans.

Volunteers Needed

Hello Ladies! Rosario Garcia here. I would like to thank all of you for the kind words of support and encouragement that were said at Saturday's meeting.





As I mentioned at the meeting, my family and I are starting a foundation called the Sew Young Foundation. Through this foundation, we have been giving away homemade bookmarks for donations and all the funds gathered will be used to help struggling students pay off their student debt.

If you would like to help us make bookmarkers, Please use the following Instructions.

- 1. Cut 2 pieces of fabric in between 2.5 4 inches wide by 7 10 inches in length. (Please keep in mind that this project is meant to be made out of scraps, therefore, any size bookmark is acceptable as long as it looks like a bookmark.)
- 2. Cut 1 piece of batting or fusible interfacing the same size as your bookmark fabric and sandwich it in between the two pieces of fabric.
- 3. Cut 1-2 pieces of ribbon about 3-4 inches long and sandwich in between the batting and fabric.

Sew a quarter inch from the edge of the bookmark through all layers and cut with pinking shears. If you do not have pinking shears you can leave the bookmarkers as is and I can cut them for you.

Bookmarkers can be dropped off at the Pharr Memorial Library in the director's office or you may call me and schedule a drop-off or pick up time at any location at your convenience.
