This type of exercise often costs corporations thousands of dollars. We are receiving it at no additional cost because we belong to the South Padre Island Chamber of Commerce. Please help us help our organization.

Why have a meeting to determine our long term goals?

Current challenges

Membership 2022 -257

Several years before, prior to pandemic, almost 400

Same people are being asked over and over to volunteer, and fewer volunteering.

Trouble finding Guild officers and chairs, no Publicity Chair for over 3 years and other key positions vacant.

Trouble finding Quilt Show chairs and filling the committees.

Several Board members doubling up on responsibilities.

The Guild funds are shrinking.

Solution

We need to evaluate our organization. Our charter with the IRS and the State of Texas states our purpose is to benefit the greater community and to provide education. We need to decide what shows we **achieved** our purposes. We need a sharper focus and implementation of it.

If not, I am concerned the Guild will shrink even more as members lose interest, lose

physical function and are forced to cut back or move out of the Valley, or simply die. I don't see many new members who would be more likely to be enthusiastic and to volunteer.

We need to make plans about how to better implement our purposes, specifically which projects fit best. Then develop timelines to achieve those purposes given the volunteer time available.

We need to decide how to implement our long-term goals.

We can set short term goals (five years or less), but we need to decide what those would be. We need to be able to explain how these goals support our long-term goals.

Imagination Station Guidelines

- An opportunity for all Bees to do a 15 minute demo both Friday and Saturday at the Quilt Show. This is an opportunity for those attending the quilt show to learn more about your Bee and also to make new friends within the Rio Grande Valley.
- Each Bee will have a table to display their Bee Banner, any information about their Bee and • If the Bee desires can SELL KITS (made for the item they demoed) for quilt show attendees to take home.
- YOUR BEE sets the amount they want to sell their kits and KEEPS THE MONEY for their Bee. • You can sell your kits at your table all day if you want, or just the hour you're scheduled to demo. THE CHOICE is yours! If you want you can leave your kits and put up an Honor system jar for the collected money that is ok. BUT the RGV Guild is NOT responsible for the money.
- Whatever your Bee decides, they are responsible for collecting the money and manning their booth. And it is ok to just do a demo and not sell kits. This is the Bee's choice.
- Since this is a 15 minute demo and Bees keep the money for selling kits, you will be expected to pay to get into the quilt show.

• DEADLINE for Bees to register to participate was December 1. Demo times for each Bee will be announced by the 2nd week of December so be on the lookout for your bee's time on the schedule.

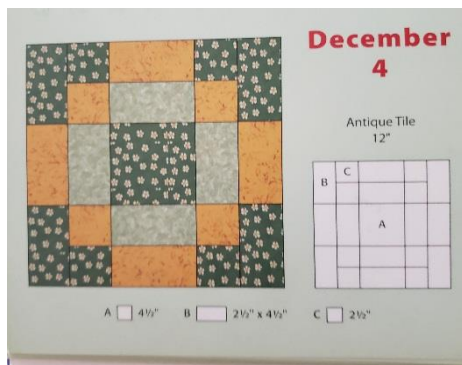
